- 7. What was Paul committed to doing for the sake of the gospel (vv. 19-22)? Name the four categories Paul became for the sake of the gospel. Does Paul say we can cast off law if necessary for the sake of the gospel? Is Paul saying anything goes as long as the gospel gets out? (Read v. 21 again).

8. What does a runner do to increase his chances of winning the race? (vv. 23-25) How does this example of a race help us understand sharing the gospel?

- 9. What does Paul say he must do in order to increase his chances of winning (v. 27)? What might a modern Christian do to increase his chances of finishing well?
- 10. What danger faces those who are not careful to guard their testimony? (v. 27) Did Paul mean that he would be cast away by God? If not, what?
