- 5. What made the Sawis curious about the Tuan? How receptive where they to Don's teaching about Jesus? What did the tribesmen think about the Judas story? (30-32)
- 6. What problem threatened the peace the Richardsons had hoped to bring to these warring tribes? (32) How did this problem turn out to become a divine icebreaker for Don in communicating the gospel? (34-35). What might we use in breaking the ice when sharing the gospel with others?
